WILDERNESS FIRST AID



Are you planning on any high adventure this year? If your crew encounters an emergency how prepared are you? If your answers to these questions were uncertain then a Wilderness First Aid course is the thing for you! Loud Thunder is hosting one May 30-31st lead by our very own Gary Pearsall of crew 119. If your CPR isn't current you can also come for the optional CPR the evening before (Friday, may 29th). This isn't a basic first aid course. you learn how to care for people hours from help, and where you may be the only line of care.

The cost is \$40, plus \$10 more if you choose to do CPR. That includes all your food and training materials for the weekend. You must be at least 16 years old to take the course.
